



Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure

2011 - 2012

The Pupil Premium Grant is a Government funded grant for all schools in England, aimed at addressing underlying inequalities. It is allocated to children (from Reception age onwards) from families who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), and children looked after in local authority care. Schools are expected to use the funding to help close attainment gaps for eligible pupils; they are free to spend the Pupil Premium Grant as they see fit but will be accountable for how they have used the funding to support pupils from low income families. There is the expectation that schools will be able to demonstrate impact on the attainment of pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium.

Summary of PPG spending 2011/12**Objectives in spending PPG:**

To accelerate the progress of Year 5 and 6 pupils underachieving in maths and writing, and year 4 pupils in writing.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Three qualified teachers employed to tutor pupils in maths and writing for pupils in years 4, 5 and 6.

Outcomes:

- 11 Year 4 pupils made on average 2.7 points progress by the end of the year
- 17 Year 5 pupils made on average 4.8 points progress in maths by the end of the year
- 12 Year 6 pupils made 3.5 points progress in maths by the end of one term alone
- 18 Year 5 pupils made on average 6.3 points progress in writing by the end of the year
- 9 Year 6 pupils made on average 4.7 points progress in writing by the end of the year
