



School Uniform

We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables children to identify with their school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents and carers.

Guidelines

- It is expected that children wear the school uniform each day, with the appropriate footwear.
- The school prospectus provides parents/carers with full details and prices of the uniform to be worn (see below).
- Most items of uniform can be purchased from the school office – see details below.
- Second-hand items are occasionally available via the school office at prices to be agreed.
- If a child does not wear the correct uniform, a verbal or written reminder of our expectations will be communicated to the parents/carers.
- If a child arrives at school wearing inappropriate clothing which causes concern (eg unsuitable for the weather, too revealing, offensive/unsuitable slogans, etc) then the school will provide uniform for the child to wear for the day and parents will be informed.
- PE kit should be kept in school all week and only taken home at weekends or at the end of each half term for washing.
- If a child does not have their PE kit in school, a letter is sent home to the parents/carers.
- Parents are asked to clearly label every item of school clothing with their child's name.
- The children are responsible for taking care of their own items of uniform.

- Lost property is located by the medical area, near year 6. Any items left unclaimed are periodically recycled.
- If there is any reason why a child cannot wear our uniform or requires special dispensation (eg health or religious grounds) then the governors will consider sympathetically any such request from a parent/carer.

Uniform details:

Girls:

Grey skirt or trousers

*Green summer dresses may be worn during warm weather

White polo-shirt (available with logo from the school office)

School sweatshirt or cardigan (purchased from school office)

White socks or grey or black tights (opaque or woollen)

Black school shoes – NOT trainers or boots

Boys:

Grey trousers

*Grey shorts during the summer

White polo-shirt (available with logo from the school office)

School sweatshirt (purchased from the school office)

Grey or black socks

Black shoes – NOT trainers

PE Kit:

Green or black shorts (green shorts can be purchased from school office)

White T-shirt (available with logo from the school office)

Black pumps

PE kits need to be kept in a named PE bag (can be purchased from school)

Make-up, nail varnish, severe haircuts, 'tramlines' and elaborate hair decoration are not acceptable for school.

On health and Safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery to school. The exceptions to this are stud ear-rings. We ask the children to remove these during PE lessons or, if they cannot be removed, to cover them with a plaster brought from home. This is to prevent them from causing an injury. If a child wishes to wear jewellery which holds a religious significance, this will of course be permitted.
