

Science

Rocks

Children will:

- compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties .
- describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock .
- recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.

Animals including humans: Movement and Feeding

Children will:

- Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat
- Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

P.E

Gymnastics and Invasion games.

Children develop skills in finding and using space to keep the ball. They play with the same basic court set-up and rules, but use a range of equipment and skills, including throwing, catching, kicking and striking skills. Children also develop the skills of flexibility, balance and strength which they demonstrate in gymnastics routines.

Geography /History

Greece and Ancient Greece

This unit introduces Year 3 to a European Country. The topic requires that children develop their locational knowledge by being able to locate and name the continents on a world map, locate the main countries of Europe, Identify the position and significance of Equator, N. and S. Hemisphere, Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn. Children will also identify key human and physical features of Greece and compare and contrast an urban and rural location. Children will undertake a large amount of research of the country using ICT to support this.

Children will discover who the Greeks are. They will learn when the Ancient Greeks lived, important events in the past, how they have influenced the western world and also compare and contrast the civilisation to today's.

Art/DT

Art: Drawing

Children will work on gaining control over their pencil, varying the marks they make and becoming increasingly confident with line and shade. They will learn different methods of shading and draw from observation and imagination

DT: Cooking

Children will design, make and evaluate their own salads. They will prepare ingredients in a range of different ways: washing, cutting, slicing, grating and mixing.
