

Climate Zones

Weather is short term. It is what happens in our atmosphere from day to day. It varies from place to place, from day to day and from season to season. The range of weather in a place is a characteristic of its climate.



Climate is long term. It refers to the average weather pattern of a place over many years. Climates can be predominantly hot, cold, dry, or wet, hot, and wet, hot, and dry and so on. The climate of a place affects the soil, flora, and fauna of that place and in turn affects the human activity in a variety of ways.

Equatorial/Tropical zone		Around the equator we have tropical climates which are hot and humid, this is where the rainforests are.	
Arid Zone		Hottest and driest places with very low rainfall and extreme seasonal temperatures, this where most of the desserts are.	
Mediterranean zone		Hot dry summers, winter has cooler temperatures with rain.	
Temperate zone		Cold winters and mild summers, usually have four distinct seasons	
Subpolar zone		Long, hard winters and short summers	
Polar zone		These have the coldest temperatures on earth	
climate		Weather patterns in a place over a long period, such as seasonal rainfall, sunshine, and temperatures.	
weather		Conditions in the atmosphere on a particular day such as temperature, windiness, rainfall, hours of sunshine or cloud cover.	
Latitude		Specifies the north-south position of a point on the earth's surface.	
Flora		Plants native to an area, such as trees, climbers, flowers, and grasses	
Fauna		Animals native to an area, such as birds, reptiles, and insects	
Season		Each of the four divisions of the year marked by weather patterns and daylight hours, resulting due to earth's changing position about sun
