Mayan Writing
The Maya created a writing
system using symbols called
glyphs. Each symbol represented
a word or sound. Glyphs were
used to record events on stone
slabs called stelae.

Key events:

800BC - Farming and trade becomes established

Around 750BC - Mayan civilisation is a major power in the region 700BC - Mayan writing system is developed

400BC - The earliest solar calendars are invented

100BC - The first pyramids are built 250AD - 950AD - The Classic Period (the height of Mayan culture) 925AD - The state of Chichen Itza becomes the most powerful 950AD - 1524AD - The Post Class

Period in which cities began to be abandoned by the Maya people and latterly, the Spanish invaded.

complex but were also used by
other Mesoamericans.

Chronological - In time order


Continuity - A state where everything stays the same.

them to do complex calculations and
make precise atronomical predictions.



Mayan gods

The Mayans worshipped many different gods. Priests performed special ceremonies to keep the gods happy. They believed that the world was divided into the Heavens, the Earth, the Underworld. Mayan kings were also thought to become gods after they died.

Sun Worship

One of the most important gods was the Sun god. It was believed that if they did not make sacrifices, the Sun would not continue to make its journey across the sky. Special ceremonies were held in temples and on mountain tops.
