<u>World's End Junior School Knowledge Organiser: Year 5 – Invasion</u> (Tag Rugby)

In this unit, the focus is on tag rugby. Children will learn how to pass and receive the ball correctly, understanding that they have to pass backwards. They will also be able to tackle correctly adhering to the tag rugby rules.
