Essential Coverage:

In this unit the children will hear the stories of some people who have led inspiring lives. The people they will hear about will give them the opportunity to reflect on their own lives, whilst thinking about the actions of others who have challenged injustice.

Words and actions of inspirational people will be used to inspire people to think about how they can try to make a difference, if only in a small way, in their own lives.
