Key Vocabulary:

charity - the voluntary giving of help, typically in the form of money, to those in need.

Zakah – payment made annually and used for charitable and religious purposes, one of the Five Pillars of Islam

festival - a day or period of celebration, typically for religious reasons

Harvest - A celebration of the annual harvest, especially (in Britain) one held in schools and as a service in Christian churches, to which gifts of food are brought for the poor.
