Religions that we are learning from:

Christianity

Lots of people travelled a long way to listen to Jesus. Jesus taught people how to live and explained God's love to them. Jesus says that people who listen to him and put his words into practice are like builders whose house stands despite the storms of life, whereas those who ignore his words are like the foolish builder whose house was destroyed.

Humanism

Humanists believe it is important to look at evidence, listen and make decisions for ourselves. Humanists evaluate the evidence and make up our minds as to whether we agree or not with a situation or action.

Islam

By listening carefully, the followers of Islam called Muslims do their best to perform Salah (prayers). Other than Salah (the five daily prayers) Muslims pray sometimes by just talking to Allah (God) about things that they might want to be able to do.

Key questions to discuss at home:

- Why should we listen to others?
- What is worth listening to?
- Which messages are important for me to pay attention to?
- Which messages/words should I not listen to?
- How do I support or encourage others to speak? Especially those who are not always heard?

Key Vocabulary:

Modest – not thinking too highly of yourself

Listen – giving attention to sound

Evaluate – form an idea based on evidence

Salah – a set of prayer performed by Muslims five times a day
