Christianity

In the United Kingdom there are many statues of people who have made an important impact on Christian communities. An example of one of these people is John Wesley who is said to have founded the Methodist church.

Sikhism

In Smethwick, near Birmingham, members of the Guru Nanak Gurdwara campaigned to have a statue of a Sikh soldier erected to commemorate all the soldiers with roots in the Indian subcontinent in the first world war.

Statues

The United Kingdom has over 800 statues, with 300 of them being located in London. People often erect statues of important people who have made a significant contribution to the lives of others. Do you know which statues are in Birmingham?

Key questions to discuss at home:

- How does remembering the past help people to move forwards?
