Religions that we are learning from:

Christianity

Jesus choose 12 disciples to follow him. These disciples showed loyalty to him at various times throughout the New Testament (in the Bible).

One of the disciples who was not loyal to Jesus was called Judas. Judas decided to lead the Jewish leaders to Jesus in return for 30 silver coins. His actions can be seen as betraying Jesus for selfish gain.

Key questions to discuss at home:

- What makes a good friend?
- To what do you show loyalty?
- How do different worshippers show commitment?

Communion

This is a Christian tradition in which Christians eat bread and drink wine to remember Jesus' last supper. The last supper is when Jesus told his followers that they should remember that he would die for the forgiveness of their sins.

Key Vocabulary:

Commitment – being dedicated to doing something

Loyal – giving or showing a firm and constant support

Steadfast – keeping going with something

Communion – Christian worship where bread and wine are eaten to remember Jesus' death and resurrection
